Writing a Procedure

Procedures give instructions or descriptions of how to do something. Directions, instructions and recipes are all examples of procedures.

Grammar features:

- Common nouns (names of common objects; for example: pencil).
- Action verbs (doing verbs; for example: turn).
- Commands (simple sentences that tell what to do).
- Steps are in the correct order.
- Present tense (the action verb is taking place now; for example: throw).

Example of a Procedure

<u>How to Sharpen a Pencil</u>

<u>What you need:</u>

- a pencil
- a sharpener
- a bin

<u>What to do:</u>



1. First, put the pencil inside the sharpener.



2. Next, turn the pencil around.



3. Then, stop and take the pencil out when you think it is sharp.



- 4. Finally, throw the pencil shavings in the bin.
- 5. Now you can write or draw!
