Unit of Inquiry: How We Express Ourselves

Central Idea: Stories are told in different ways and for different purposes.

Lines of Inquiry:

- Different ways of telling stories (form).
- Elements of a story (form).
- The responses that stories can evoke (perspective).

Teacher Questions:

- What can we learn from stories?
- What are common elements that are in every story?
- How do different stories make us feel?
- Why do we tell stories?
- What kinds of stories are there?

PYP Attitude of the week: Each week, Grade 2 has a focus PYP Attitude or Learner Profile. This week we will be discussing enthusiasm. Enthusiasm means that students enjoy learning and willingly put effort into learning. Students think positively and try their best.

English Language Arts:

- Daily 5 Throughout the literacy lesson, students are reading to themselves, reading to a friend, working on their writing independently, listening to reading and practicing making words. Students are also reading with their teacher in small groups.
- Writing: Students are learning to write *narratives*. Narratives tell a story. They are written to entertain and evoke responses in the reader, listener or viewer.
- Grammar: Action Verbs. Action verbs are doing words. They are actions.
 - o I am <u>running</u> fast.
 - o The plane is <u>flying</u> high in the sky.
 - o I ate eggs for breakfast.

Phonics: -ing

Spelling: thing, string, bring, fling, sling, ringing, clinging, stinging, writing, reading.
