**Unit of Inquiry:** Sharing the Planet

**Central Idea:** Living things depend upon each other and their habitat.

**Lines of Inquiry:**

- Characteristics of organisms (form).
- Characteristics of habitats (form).
- The interaction between an organism and its habitat (connection).

**Teacher Questions:**

- What are the needs of living things?
- What is a habitat?
- Why is a habitat important?
- How do living things in a habitat support each other?

**English Language Arts:**

- Daily 5 – Throughout the literacy lesson, students are reading to themselves, reading to a friend, working on their writing independently, listening to reading and practicing making words. Students are also reading with their teacher in small groups.
- Writing: Students are learning to write *information reports*. Information Reports give a factual description of a thing or animal. It is written in the present tense and includes important facts which describe the animals appearance, habitat, diet and behaviours.
- Grammar: Collective nouns. A collective noun is a word for a group of specific items, animals or people. For example, a group of ships is called a fleet, a group of cows is called a herd, a group of lions is called a pride, a group of baseball players is called a team, and a group of ants is called a colony.
